Blueberry Hill will become a publicly accessible Nature Preserve with interpretive walking trails and opportunities for outdoor recreation that is part of our way of life - from hikers and fisherman to young children who play in parks. Protecting Blueberry Hill will ensure that we still have place to hike, bike, fish, see wildlife or just enjoy the quiet and peace of nature.

Fundraising Goal

To raise \$35,000 (17% has been raised) in pledges for stewardship fund that will be used for future protection and management of Blueberry Hill Preserve. Once the pledges are raised and the funding for Henderson Brook and associated wetland restoration received, the Nature Trust and the Friends of Blueberry Hill will safeguard this natural area for community use and enjoyment.

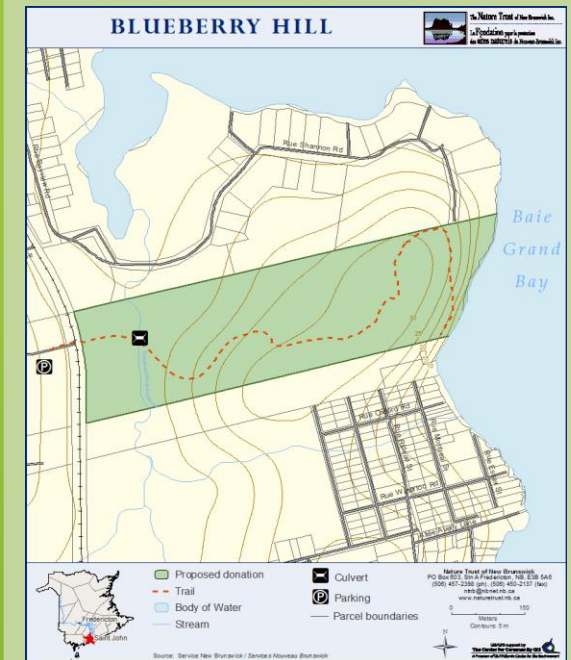

The Friends of Blueberry Hill is a grassroots volunteer group with members from City of Saint John and Town of Grand Bay-Westfield that works with the Nature Trust towards conservation of the Blueberry Hill Property.

Once Blueberry Hill becomes one of the Trust's Nature Preserves, the Friends of Blueberry Hill will become stewards of the land and assist the Nature Trust with its management. Your pledge for donation will ensure that this beautiful natural area will not disappear before our children and grandchildren have a chance to enjoy it.



History

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed with Worksafe New Brunswick in 2008 to transfer ownership of the Blueberry Hill property to the Nature Trust. The Nature Trust has organized several public meetings and events to consider the needs of local citizens and to investigate solutions to several issues including the road access and the Henderson Brook culverts. As a result, a local group Friends of Blueberry Hill was established and took the initiative to help the Nature Trust with securing this property and raise stewardship funds necessary prior to the Nature Trust taking on responsibility for the property.
